Our Next Saturday Meeting

Directions to Lyman's shop:

Interstate 10 is still under construction

From Beaumont: take the Old Hwy 90 exit. Stay on the eastbound access road until you come to Rose City Drive.

From Orange: Due to the construction, take the Hwy 105 (Vidor) exit. Stay on the access road to the Workman Turnaround. Go under Interstate 10 and stay on the eastbound access road to Rose City Drive. Ace Trucking used to occupy the building at the intersection of Rose City Drive and the feeder road. I think there's a boat shop there now. Turn right on Rose City Drive, then go across the railroad tracks and turn back to the left on Old Hwy 90. Take the first road to the right (Birch Road). Follow Birch Road to the right, then to the left, which will be Cardinal Drive. Lyman's house is the second one on the left. His shop is in the back.
