Tool Reviews



John Phelps showed us his new pin-nailer by Cadex. It's a lot like a brad nailer but it drives headless, 23 gauge, pins of various lengths. The very

sharp pins are made of hardened steel so they drive very easily. Because they are headless, they are nearly invisible but they hold really well. They're especially good for nailing trim to cabinets and furniture.



Woodworker's Paradise is now handling the Festool line of power tools. Among them, this strange looking 12 volt battery powered drill. It has a special 3 phase motor and internal controls that

provide maximum power and eliminates burned out motors.



Festool also makes a sander that changes from a rotary orbital motion for course sanding to eccentric motion for fine

sanding. It also has a rotary orbital motion that's used for polishing. The dust pickup is very effective and it keeps the sanding dust from accumulating between the sand paper and the work piece for faster sanding. While the Festool line is relatively expensive, they are very well made and carry a 3-year warranty.

Woodworker's Paradise will host the club on Saturday, March 24th at 1PM with a first hand look of the Festool line of power tools. B.J. is really excited about the Festool line.

Program

John Phelps presented a program on designing and building bases for various types of furniture. Some of the types he covered:

- No separate base the bottom of the cabinets is designed to rest on the floor
- Directly attached feet- these are separate feet (usually round turned pieces) that are attached directly to the bottom of the carcass
- Attached moldings decorative molding is applied to the bottom of the piece to form a footing
- Leg and rail base like a small table base that the furniture piece rests on
- Shaped box base similar to the leg and rail base, but usually has more decorative router and scroll work


 Ogee bracket feet – similar to the directly attached feet, but made with mitered corners and decorative scroll work.
