Tool Reviews



Richard Hicks showed a Kapro 935-10 level he bought from Amazon. It has easy to read 'red lined'

bubbles, degree marks on each side of the bubble, magnets in the base and a rotating angle finder. Cost was about \$25.

Program

Richard Hicks presentation covered a step by step table saw alignment procedure he uses on his contractor and cabinet saws. The construction of the saws is different and the alignment adjustments are different. A properly aligned saw is safer and more accurate to use.

The first step is to remove the power source from the saw. Richard mounted power receptacles on the front of the saws so he could physically unplug the saws.

Next he showed each step in the alignment:

1. Clean and lubricate the internal parts of the saw
2. Set the 45 and 90 degree stops using a square of digital gauge
3. Align the miter slot to the blade with the blade at 90 and 45 degrees
4. Align the rip fence to the miter slot - offset to the right of the blade by .005" to reduce kickback danger
5. Align the miter gauge to the blade at 90 and 45 degrees

Richard suggests replacing the factory miter gauge with a more accurate one. He likes the Incra V27 costing about \$55 at Hartville Tool.
