Larry Neff shows his Fein sander with the various cutting and sanding attachments.



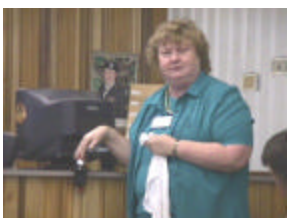
Waid Gauthier shows off his favorite spray gun – a gravity feed model from Porter Cable. He normally sprays lacquer on his products and like this gun because of its small size.
