Four photos of pecan pieces I have turned from the downed tree in my yard. You have seen two of the pieces in the first photo but the tall vase is new....a trial to hollow! I started the hollowing with a Forstner bit with an extension and then expanded the opening and tapered the hollow.

The last three photos are a new concept for me. I noticed how much wood I was removing from narrow-necked vases and decided to try a captive ring. This piece didn't turn out quite how I planned as I had to do some reworking after it flew off the lathe while finishing the base.....ten hours into the project. The ring is still captive but it cracked and is now technically a split ring. I plan to try another captive ring vase.

10/23/2020

I recently spotted some maple that had been taken out to the roadside on my street. It had been a big co-dominant-trunked tree that came down during Hurricane Laura. I got permission to get a few pieces just before the big truck rolled up to haul it off. I made a big open vase with the good half of a log that was split, a natural edge bowl from a place where the trunks met, and a tall slender vase with a small diameter log I grabbed off the pile as an afterthought. The grain looks so much better turning along the diameter of the trunk! The slender vase is finished with two coats of wipe-on poly and a final coat of spray poly. The other two pieces are wipe-on/wipe-off butcher block oil.

I used red oak, stained it with Minwax Golden Oak stain and finished it with Minwax Wipe-on Satin Poly. The center pieces are held, in dados, with screws so they can be removed for possible future revisions.
