John Phelps brought pictures of some fence gates he rebuilt for his daughter.



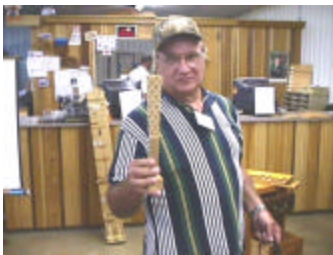
Howard Hartman is making belt buckles again. This one was made with Osage Orange which is usually bright yellow when freshly cut - then it turns a rich brown color.

Lyman Frugia turned some jar lid covers for wife to use as presents. He turns the disk and epoxies a Mason Jar lid in it.



Jerry Shivers has a new tool in his shop. He recently purchased a Legacy Machine and plans to use it to make special 'round' parts for furniture projects.



Herman Davis carved this walking staff. Herman is a fast carver and uses it to hold people's attention in his ministry.



Steve Brady finished his sign project from his carving class. He's carving a pelican as his next project.



Rob Emanuel laminated maple and walnut for his salt & pepper grinders. He used a ceramic mechanism for the salt grinder and machined steel for the pepper grinder.

## Program

Dan Orgeron, a former member, presented a program about the techniques he used to make a single pedestal, frame & panel computer desk.

Dan uses a program called Woodshop Calculator to make dimensioned plans for his frame and panel projects. Since his panels are large, he dowels the rail and stiles together. As a safety measure, he uses a stock feeder when shaping his panels. He eliminates splintering on plywood crosscuts by putting blue masking tape on the cut line. Dan applies glue to his biscuit joints with a foam paintbrush.
